Prefixes and Base Words

Teaching

You can use your knowledge of different word parts to figure out the meaning of many unfamiliar words. A **base word** is a complete word that can stand alone. A **prefix** is a word part that appears at the beginning of a base word to form a new word. For example, consider the word *prehistoric*.

The prefix pre- means "before."

The base word historic means "based on events in history."

pre + historic = prehistoric

When the word parts are combined, prehistoric means "before recorded history."

The chart below lists eight common prefixes.

Prefix	Meaning	Example	
pre-	before	prepay	
post-	after, later	postdate	
inter-	among, between	interconnect	
intra-	within	intramuscular	
re-	back, again	reappear	
sub-	under	subhuman	
super-	above, beyond	superpower	
trans-	across	transplant
